## Message From May's Desk:

Here I go again. I know some of you are rolling your eyes and saying, she is at it again. But hearing Barbara Wold speak to us a couple of weeks ago just confirmed my beliefs one more time. All the world is retail! My mantra. Show me a business that doesn't sell something to somebody and I will show you a business out of business. Law practice? Selling advice. Insurance? Selling protection from possibilities. Consultant? Selling experience and guidance. Even schools are selling something to their students – an education.



How we approach our marketplace is different for each business, but the basics of good old fashioned customer service and customer development are the same whether you are selling safe deposit boxes or dental hygiene. Who is it you are trying to reach. More than once I have been surprised to find a business has limited hours or is unavailable by phone or email. If you want my business, you have to consider how and when I can get to you. If my only time is after 5 or 6 in the evening and weekends and you are open 10 to 4 when it is raining Monday to Friday, guess what? We will never meet! And if I call and leave a message that gets no response, two strikes and you are out! You wouldn't believe how often that is the case in both instances.

One more pet peeve and then I will shut up – at least for this month. Follow up. So many of the people I do business with personally or would like to, have

no follow up. For more years than I am willing to tell (you will be able to guess too close to my real age), I worked with a major supplier of social expression merchandise. A household word.

Owns their own cable network channel. Twelve times a year, minimum, they did a mailing to their best customers. The ones who had already demonstrated loyalty. They didn't take anyone for granted. That is good marketing. And the consumer felt well served and recognized as someone important to the company. That's how I like to be treated by those businesses I regularly patronize. Especially the bank that gets to hold my money. Especially the insurance agency that sells us our policies. Etc., etc.

Oh, one more – so I lied. I heard "we don't have a store front" ... Oh, yes you do! You have a logo, a business card and a website. You may have a sign on the building. You have a message and a menu on your phone answering service. Those are the elements of your "front door".

This is a time when we all have to be sure to take a hard look or listen to how we greet our potential customer and what first impression we make. Barbara Wold had a lot of good advice. Most common sense that doesn't hurt repeating. Call the office and I will send her handout to you, if you missed the workshop. It is worth taking a look.

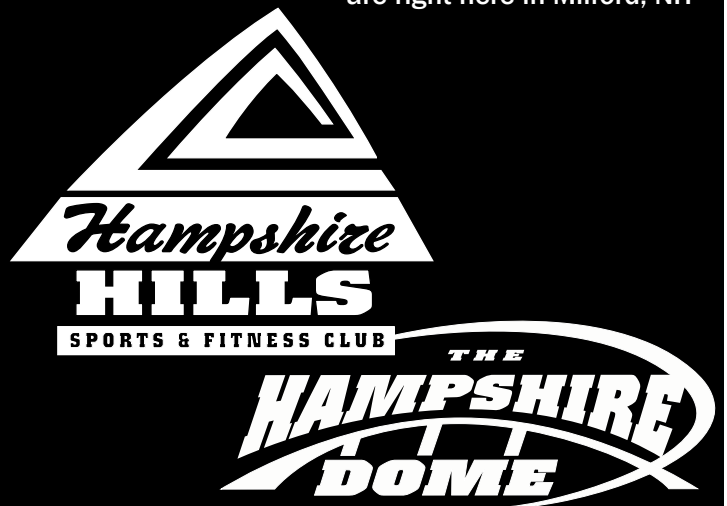

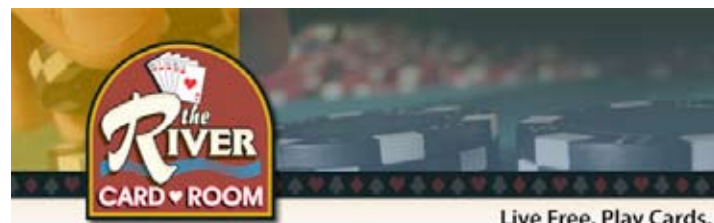
