A Conversation with Paul Tripp of Classic Signs

Paul Tripp and I are both members of the Souhegan Valley Chamber's Referral Group working together to meet new business owners, network our businesses and ultimately give and receive referrals for our business.

Last year Paul's business, Classic Signs, was a vendor at the 2009 Southern New Hampshire Business Expo. Paul's main objective was to meet and greet the other businesses at the Expo.

Paul knows how important networking with other local businesses is for his business. He is an active member of the SVCC Referral Group where he meets with 20 other business owners to give and receive referrals. Paul knows that attending the Business Expo is very important to his business so he can keep in touch with the people he does business for all year. Paul states, "90% of my business is conducted over the phone, my repeat customers call in their orders monthly and we chat for a few minutes on the phone. Going to the Expo puts a good portion of my customers in one room, giving me the opportunity to speak face to face with them, sort of an extended Business After Hours."

To sum up Paul's experience: "My business participates in the Expo for one purpose, it provides us exposure to the community and the businesses that we work with. We might not sell anything that day but meeting with the customers at the Expo gives them a reminder that we are still out there making signs." Paul also adds that he tells his customers, "A business with no sign is a sign of no business."

There are many reasons exhibitors participate in the Business Expo. While Paul's is mainly Business to Business, other business owners attend the Expo to expose their business to the people of the community. There are non-profit agencies and the local schools who are vendors as well, enlightening the community about their business purpose.

Networking Tips for You and Your Business

Effective business networking is the linking together of individuals who, through trust and relationship building, become walking, talking advertisements for one another.

Keep in mind that networking is about being genuine and authentic, building trust and relationships, and seeing how you can help others.

Ask yourself what your goals are in participating in networking meetings so that you will pick groups that will help you get what you are looking for. Some meetings are based more on learning, making contacts, and/or volunteering rather than on strictly making business connections.

Visit as many groups as possible that spark your interest. Notice the tone and attitude of the group. Do the people sound supportive of one another? Does the leadership appear competent? Many groups will allow you to visit two times before joining.

Hold volunteer positions in organizations. This is a great way to stay visible and give back to groups that have helped you.

Ask open-ended questions in networking conversations. This means questions that ask who, what, where, when, and how as opposed to those that can be answered with a simple yes or no. This form of questioning opens up the discussion and shows listeners that you are interested in them.

Become known as a powerful resource for others. When you are known as a strong resource, people remember to turn to you for suggestions, ideas, names of other people, etc. This keeps you visible to them.

Have a clear understanding of what you do and why, for whom, and what makes your doing it special or different from others doing the same thing. In order to get referrals, you must first have a clear understanding of what you do that you can easily articulate to others.

Be able to articulate what you are looking for and how others may help you. Too often people in conversations ask, "How may I help you?" and no immediate answer comes to mind.

Follow through quickly and efficiently on referrals you are given. When people give you referrals, your actions are a reflection on them. Respect and honor that and your referrals will grow.
