October Blizzard Raises Insurance Questions

When Mother Nature gets her ire up and decides to let us have it, we'd better be prepared. One of the best precautions that we can take is to make sure that we have the insurance coverage that we need to respond to the multitude of perils that Mother Nature can throw at us during a storm. If you own a business, you want to make sure that you have 'time element' coverage in the event of a power outage off premises. What this means is that if a power line is down and the power line is not on your (the insured's) premises, you want the insurance company to pay for the loss of business income that you incur because you can't open your doors for business. For example, a restaurant owner will not be able to serve his or her customers if there is no power for lights, water pumps, heat, etc. Without customers the restaurant will lose income over time. Hence, the term 'time element'. The longer the restaurant is without power, the more income it will lose. Business owners can endorse their insurance policies for an extra fee to cover loss of income in the event that there is a power outage off premises. This coverage is usually added as part of a package or 'bucket' of other coverages which has various names, such as Valu-Pak Plus, Select Plus, etc. The extra premium for this bucket of coverages usually ranges from \$200 to \$250. Additional coverage for valuable papers, money, securities,

signs, etc. is usually included in the bucket.

One of the most commonly asked questions about what Mother Nature literally throws at us during a storm often times pertains to the neighbor's tree. "The neighbor's tree fell on my property. Will his insurance company pay to have it removed?" Unfortunately, the answer is 'no'. This falls under the legendary 'Act of God' exclusion. The neighbor's insurance policy will only respond if there is damage due to his or her negligence. In this case, the neighbor didn't do anything wrong. It was Mother Nature's tempestuous ways (i.e., an act of God) that knocked the tree over. The only legitimate case for damages in this instance is against Mother Nature, not the neighbor. If, however, the neighbor's tree falls on your house, your car or other property that you own, you can place a claim with your home or auto insurance carrier. There is no claim that you can make against your neighbor's insurance company, unless you can prove negligence on the neighbor's part. Maybe the neighbor should have cut his tree down knowing that it was dying and would fall on your property in the event of a storm. If you can build a case of negligence against your neighbor, you might have a shot at recovering from his insurance policy. Otherwise, unfortunately, you're only course of action resides in a higher authority.
